

Who Should Attend

Contractors and subcontractors that will be performing work on federal construction projects to which the Davis-Bacon Act applies are encouraged to attend.

The President's economic stimulus package includes a large amount of spending on "green jobs" and "infrastructure" projects. All of these projects are subject to the Davis-Bacon Act, which requires the payment of "prevailing wages" on federal projects and projects with federal financing.

It is essential that all construction companies, especially those that will be looking for work on federal projects, become familiar with the Davis-Bacon Act and its requirements.

Those contractors and subcontractors that will be engaging in federal contracting work for the first time are encouraged to attend and learn the basic requirements of the Act.
